

# MONTHLY FULL REPORT ON MANUFACTURERS' SHIPMENTS, INVENTORIES AND ORDERS APRIL 2025

Release Number: CB 25-71 M3-2 (25)-04

**June 3, 2025** — The U.S. Census Bureau announces the April full report on manufacturers' shipments, inventories and orders:





# **Summary**

New orders for manufactured goods in April, down following four consecutive monthly increases, decreased \$22.8 billion or 3.7 percent to \$594.6 billion, the U.S. Census Bureau reported today. This followed a 3.4 percent March increase. Shipments, down two consecutive months, decreased \$1.8 billion or 0.3 percent to \$598.9 billion. This followed a 0.2 percent March decrease. Unfilled orders, up eleven of the last twelve months, increased \$0.7 billion or virtually unchanged to \$1,408.5 billion. This followed a 1.6 percent March increase. The unfilled orders-to-shipments ratio was 6.77, down from 6.86 in March. Inventories, down following six consecutive monthly increases, decreased \$0.5 billion or 0.1 percent to \$943.6 billion. This followed a 0.1 percent March increase. The inventories-to-shipments ratio was 1.58, up from 1.57 in March.

# **New Orders**

New orders for manufactured durable goods in April, down following four consecutive monthly increases, decreased \$20.0 billion or 6.3 percent to \$296.2 billion, unchanged from the previously published decrease. This followed a 7.6 percent March increase. Transportation equipment, also down following

four consecutive monthly increases, drove the decrease, \$20.4 billion or 17.1 percent to \$98.7 billion. New orders for manufactured nondurable goods decreased \$2.8 billion or 0.9 percent to \$298.4 billion.

# Shipments

Shipments of manufactured durable goods in April, up five consecutive months, increased \$1.0 billion or 0.3 percent to \$300.5 billion, down from the previously published 0.4 percent increase. This followed a 0.2 percent March increase. Transportation equipment, up four of the last five months, drove the increase, \$1.4 billion or 1.4 percent to \$97.8 billion. Shipments of manufactured nondurable goods, down two consecutive months, decreased \$2.8 billion or 0.9 percent to \$298.4 billion. This followed a 0.7 percent March decrease. Petroleum and coal products, also down two consecutive months, led the decrease, \$2.6 billion or 4.6 percent to \$54.6 billion.

# **Unfilled Orders**

Unfilled orders for manufactured durable goods in April, up eleven of the last twelve months, increased \$0.7 billion or virtually unchanged to \$1,408.5 billion, unchanged from the previously published increase. This followed a 1.6 percent March increase. Transportation equipment, up two consecutive months, drove the increase, \$0.9 billion or 0.1 percent to \$850.9 billion.

# **Inventories**

Inventories of manufactured durable goods in April, up seven consecutive months, increased \$0.9 billion or 0.2 percent to \$586.8 billion, up from the previously published 0.1 percent increase. This followed a 0.1 percent March increase. Transportation equipment, up five of the last six months, led the increase, \$0.2 billion or 0.1 percent to \$188.5 billion. Inventories of manufactured nondurable goods, down following five consecutive monthly increases, decreased \$1.4 billion or 0.4 percent to \$356.7 billion. This followed a 0.1 percent March increase. Petroleum and coal products, down two consecutive months, led the decrease, \$1.2 billion or 2.5 percent to \$44.6 billion. By stage of fabrication, April materials and supplies increased 0.7 percent in durable goods and decreased 0.2 percent in nondurable goods. Work in process increased 0.1 percent in durable goods and decreased 1.7 percent in nondurable goods. Finished goods decreased 0.5 percent in durable goods and 0.1 percent in nondurable goods.

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

Figures in text are adjusted for seasonality, but not for inflation. Figures on new and unfilled orders exclude data for semiconductor manufacturing.

"Virtually unchanged" indicates that the change is less than 0.05 percent for a percent increase or decrease.

# **Description of the survey**

This report is compiled from results of the U.S. Census Bureau's Manufacturers' Shipments, Inventories, and Orders (M3) survey, which is a voluntary survey authorized by Title 13 of the United States Code. This survey provides statistics on a calendar-month basis for manufacturers' value of shipments, new orders (net of cancellations), end-of-month order backlog (unfilled orders), end-of-month total inventory (at current cost or market value), and inventories by stage of fabrication (materials and supplies, work-inprocess, and finished goods). Data published from the M3 survey are based on a panel of approximately 4,700 reporting units that represent approximately 3,000 companies and provide an indication of monthto-month change for the Manufacturing Sector. These reporting units may be divisions of diversified large companies, large homogenous companies, or single-unit manufacturers in 92 industry categories, which are combined into 65 publication levels due to the small monthly panel size. The survey methodology assumes that the month-to-month changes of the total operations of the reporting units in the M3 panel effectively represent the month-to-month movements of all establishments that make up the category. The companies for which shipments data are currently reported or imputed in the M3 survey represent approximately 58 percent of the total value of shipments for manufacturing establishments in the 2022 Economic Census, and these companies include roughly 52 percent of the manufacturing companies with \$500 million or more in shipments in the 2022 Economic Census. The companies for which shipments data are currently reported in the M3 survey represent approximately 38 percent of the total value of shipments for manufacturing establishments in the 2022 Economic Census. Statistics based on the M3 panel differ from the results that would be obtained from a complete enumeration of all manufacturing companies. The M3 panel is not based on a probability sample; therefore, the sampling errors that are normally provided with sample surveys cannot be measured. Nonsampling errors are attributable to many

sources. The use of company or divisional reports to estimate the monthly change for establishments is one source of nonsampling error. The use of primarily large companies to represent the month-to-month movement of all companies is another potential source. Any corrections will be published in the full report. Corrections received after the full report will be released in the next month's advance report. Any revisions made later than two months will be reflected in the annual benchmark publication. # **Special Notice:**

Starting with the June 2025 data released on July 25, 2025, the Advance Total Manufacturing publication will include detailed data for all nondurable industries from the Manufacturers' Shipments, Inventories, and Orders Survey. These estimates will be available on both a seasonally and not seasonally adjusted basis and will be included in the Advance Total Manufacturing Estimates file on the M3 website under the "Latest Monthly Advance report on Manufacturers' Shipments, Inventories and Order", Monthly Advance Report on Durable Goods Manufacturers' Shipments Inventories and Orders - Press Releases (census.gov).

#### Benchmark notice:

Revised historical data from the Manufacturers' Shipments, Inventories, and Orders (M3) Survey were issued on May 16, 2025. These revisions resulted from:

- Benchmarking the M3 shipments and inventories data to the 2022 Economic Census (EC) data on a 2017 NAICS basis, as well as to revised ASM data from 2018 through 2021, resulting from benchmarking the ASM to the 2022 Economic Census;
- Incorporating the unfilled orders to shipments ratios obtained for 2021 and 2022 from the Manufacturers' Unfilled Orders (M3UFO) Survey by applying these ratios to the respective ASM and EC shipments data, as well as incorporating revised unfilled orders to shipments ratios for prior years;
- Adjusting the new orders data to be consistent with the benchmarked shipments and unfilled orders data;
- Correcting monthly data for late receipts, reclassifications of reported data, and revisions to previously reported data;
- Updating the seasonally adjusted data based on the results of benchmarking and the recent annual review of the seasonal adjustment models.

Estimates of shipments and new orders are for the duration of the period, while estimates of unfilled orders and total inventories are for the end of the period. Not seasonally adjusted estimates of shipments and new orders are for the duration of the period, while estimates of unfilled orders include adjusted data for non-calendar reporters. Seasonally adjusted estimates include concurrent adjustments for holiday and trading-day differences, where appropriate, as well as seasonal variation, based on the results of the latest annual review of the model parameters. Estimates are not adjusted for price changes.

Estimates and percent changes of shipments for the semiconductor industry are included in computers and electronic products, and all other applicable aggregate totals.

Note: Estimates of manufacturers' shipments, inventories and orders are subject to survey error and revision. One major component of survey error is nonsampling error, which includes errors of coverage, response, and nonreporting. Since the survey panel is not a probability sample, estimates of sampling error cannot be calculated.
